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Answers to Exercise B1.

1. जनकः च बालः च खादतः । तौ सीदतः ।

janakaḥ ca bālaḥ ca khādataḥ; tau sīdataḥ; the-father and the-boy and they-two-eat. they-two_M they-two-sit. The father and the boy eat. They-two (m.) sit.

2. गजः गच्छति ते च आगच्छतः । अश्वः धावति ।

gajaḥ gacchati te ca āgacchataḥ ; aśvaḥ dhāvati ; the-elephant he-goes they-two $_{\scriptscriptstyle {\rm FN}}$ and they-two-come. the-horse he-runs. The elephant goes and they-two (f.n.) come. The horse runs.

3. आचार्यः नरः बालः वा पिबति काकः च पश्यति ।

ācāryaḥ naraḥ bālaḥ vā pibati kākaḥ ca paśyati; the-teacher the-man the-boy or he-drinks the-crow and he-sees. The teacher, the man, or the boy drinks and the crow sees.

4. त्वम् अहम् च पृच्छावः । नृपः बोधति वदति च ।

tvam aham ca pṛcchāvaḥ; nṛpaḥ bodhati vadati ca; you I and we-two-ask. the-king he-knows he-speaks and You and I ask. The king knows and speaks.

5. अत्र तिष्ठतः च वदतः च । तत्र आचार्यः सीदति ।

atra tiṣṭhataḥ ca vadataḥ ca ; tatra ācāryaḥ sīdati ; here they-two-stand and^B they-two-speak and^B. there the-teacher he-sits. Here (they-two) stand and^B speak. There the teacher sits.

6. नृपः गच्छति आगच्छति च । सः जयति पिबति च ।

nṛpaḥ gacchati āgacchati ca; saḥ jayati pibati ca; the-king he-goes he-comes and^A. he he-conquers he-drinks and^A. The king goes and comes. He conquers and drinks.
